How can one week at Royal Family Kids' Camp™ make a difference in a young life?

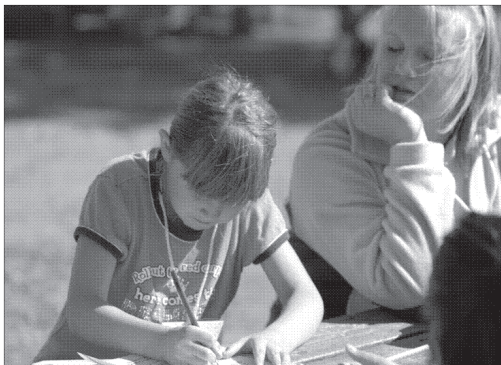

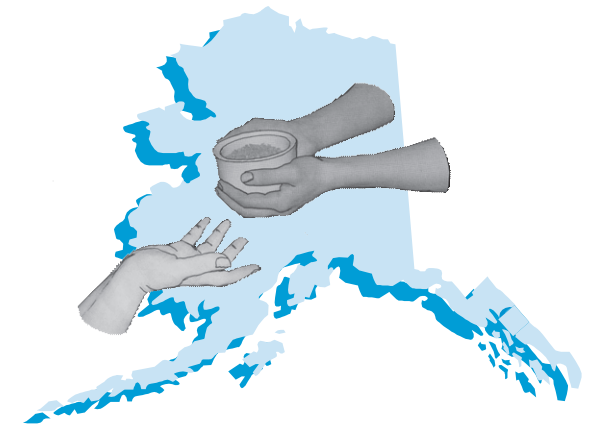
